Dear Parents, Guardians Students and Hampton Community,

As we all face the complexities of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, we want to thank you for your understanding, patience, and flexibility. Today, Governor Sununu issued a directive that all schools would initiate “remote learning” for students through April 3rd. We recognize the impact of the closure and the stress that it puts on your families and the daily routines you all have as a family. As we move forward we want to continue to deliver instruction and to support our students. With that said, I want to provide you with an overview of our planning, preparations and expectation for the next 3 weeks.

- On Monday and Tuesday, teachers will be developing plans for students that will provide continuity of their learning while buildings are closed.
- A survey will be sent on Monday, March 16 to include questions regarding access to the internet as well as school meal programming. We ask that you return this survey immediately to aid us in our planning for remote learning.
- On Tuesday March 17th from 12:00 to 4:00 pm we ask that you pick up assignments and materials provided by the teacher. This may include chromebooks and chargers for the students to utilize at home.
- Beginning on Wednesday March 18th your child can expect to begin engaging in remote instruction. Your child’s teacher will provide specific expectations for remote learning. This will be supported both digitally (depending on grade) and with provided materials.
- For students who receive special education services, your special education teacher/case manager will be in contact with you to explain how they will deliver remote specialized instruction, services and support.
- The district can provide meals for students that rely on breakfast and lunch while at school. This will be available through parent pick up or delivery. We will share more information regarding access to school meals in a future communication.

In order to ensure that communication reaches you it is imperative that your email and contact number is updated. If you have changes please do not hesitate to contact your child’s school. The school offices will remain open throughout the school closure.

I am sure that you may have a myriad of questions and concerns relating to the school closure. I assure you that we will work with your schools’ administrators to provide you with the guidance you may need and to determine what works best for your student and family.
